Child Progress Report

Bandjani Kombate is doing fine these days. Like the other children of the Development Unit (DU), he was vaccinated against meningitis and medically checked up respectively in May and August last year, on the initiative of the DU, and he was treated for ring worm. Since then, he has enjoyed a good health.

He takes three meals daily. He mainly eats cereals dough with vegetable soup, rice, and beans. He enjoys his meals and grows up well.

At home, Bandjani feeds their poultry and leads them in to their house in the evening. At weekends, he leads their animals to pasture or accompanies his parents to the farm. Bandjani is happy because the goat bough from your money gift in December 2009 has produced 2 kids. In his free time, he likes to chat and play football with his friends. They also like to make toy eye glasses, radios, etc. Bandjani is a social and serviceable boy.

Regarding his education, Bandjani is has repeated primary class one this year (2010-2011). He is good at recitation and drawing. At the beginning of the school year, he received school stationery and uniform from the DU. His sister Limanmè is repeating primary class one. She also benefited from school stationery. His brother Batoka and sister Mindilabe help their parents with farming.

The other members of the family are fine too. The family's housing has not changed. The house is kept clean and hygiene is observed. According to the mother, they got low harvests last season due to bad rain conditions. So they have to buy additional food with revenues from their income generating activity and selling some hens. They are keeping 12 hens, 7 guinea-fowls, 3 goats, and 2 draft oxen. As income generating activity, the mother brews and sells local drink. They family plans to improve their crop production by using fertiliser.
